Rossendale	Key Priority: Service Review for Over 75s/Care Home Support Nurses
	Area of Interest/Innovation: As part of the Lancashire Refugee Re-settlement Programme in July four families have been placed in Rossendale, with in total eighteen refugees seeking GP registration in the locality. Within a short time after their arrival all of the refugees were able to attend and be registered at their nearest GP Practice. Four different Rossendale practices are involved and furthermore on 7 th August all of the refugees were invited to attend a locality welcome event at Haslingden Community Link and will going forward be able to attend the Rossendale Refugee and Asylum Seeker Support Group (RRASS) each week.

Issues for Consideration:

There are no longer locality leads for Hyndburn and Pendle. This leadership issue will be addressed through the new Local Integrated Care Partnership/Primary Care Network structure.
