- A distinctive red bag with "Together a healthier future" emblazoned on the front
- Accompanying care home residents, when they are admitted to hospital.
- This is because, now when a decision is made for a care home resident to go to hospital, the care home has packed a red bag to go with the resident.





- Accompanies the care home resident from admission, at, and with discharge back to the care home.
- Holds all the essential belongings and documents that a care home resident and hospital staff need when a patient is admitted to hospital.
- Contents are day of discharge clothes, toiletries and personal aids (ie glasses, hearing aids etc), and medication.
- 6 'must have' documents: (1) Residents
 Assessment Form (2) CARES escalation
 record (3) MAR Sheet (4) This is me
 leaflet (5) Checklist, and (6) Medicines
 hospital admission checklist.
- The red bag is convenient, easily identifiable and portable.





THE JOURNEY OF BETTY AND THE RED BAG



1: Betty has become unwell and so Jenny (the Care Home Lead) does an assessment of Betty's condition, liaises with the appropriate service and a decision is made that Betty needs to go to hospital.

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2: While waiting for the ambulance, Jenny packs a Red Bag to go with Betty to the hospital.

3: The Red Bag is given



5: Ward staff will contact the care home within 48 hours of admission and discuss the patient's care and

future discharge.

- This is a pilot and we will evaluate everyone's experience of it.
- We anticipate that initially there will be very small numbers of residents which will make the pilot manageable for everyone.
- Following evaluation, lessons shared or learned, and any tweaks, we will roll the scheme out to all Care Homes in Pennine Lancashire
